College Credit

In order to earn college credit at Child Start, a student takes ten hours of level 3 PDE instruction, in the course of the program year. At the end of the year, he or she will submit these PDE certificates, along with tuition, to be converted into one college credit-hour.

Participating Institutions:

- Butler Community College
- Southwestern College
- Wichita State University

Enrollment: Students should enroll and pay tuition early in the semester in which they will complete the last PDE.

Level 3: All of our PDE's are assigned a level according to the Core Competencies for Early Care and Education Professionals. Level three indicates college-level instruction.

College Credit: The course will count as an early childhood elective and will be ungraded.

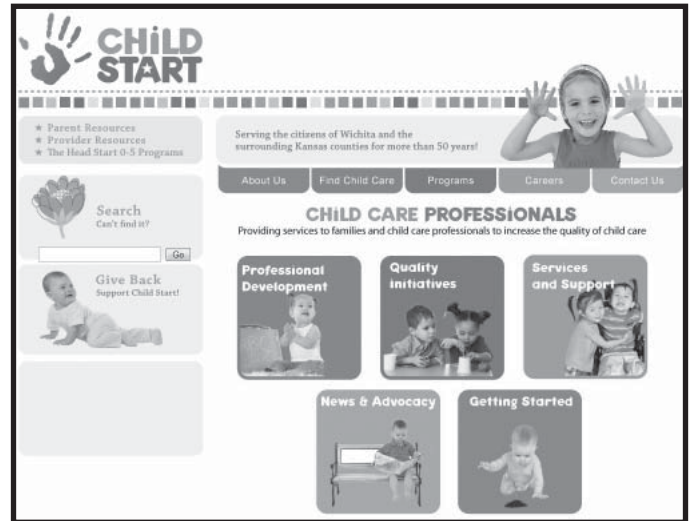
